



You may have heard or read in the news that the Government have pledged to spend £165 million to transform local skills, under the Local Skills Improvement Fund. The aim of the fund is to boost skills training, helping students to secure good jobs close to where they live. This will mean a rise in apprenticeships, as the Government plan to meet the needs of local businesses and institutions. The money will go to colleges so that they can increase their course and training offers, to improve their training facilities and to fund students and mature students to access them.

You may have noticed that the former Maplins (next to Halfords), in Hampden Park Retail Park has been transformed into a Green Training Hub. This Hub, managed by ESCG in partnership with OHM Energyand is designed to upskill plumbers, electricians, and everybody in the construction sector to take on board 'Green construction changes' to retrofit old and new buildings. Careers in the Green Sector are due to take off, so if you are interested in the environment then think about a career in the Green Sector.
