The skills shortages have been highlighted to be in the following sectors: •digital, including data engineering, software development and marketing •technical, including construction and engineering

 ·health and social care, including care management and well-being
 ·HGV driving, including if you're new to HGV driving or want to return
 ·business and administration, including project management and insurance


Hospitality staff shortages in the UK

Recent data has revealed that the number of vacancies in the NHS and social care sectors has increased since September 2020. Health bodies and organisations have warned that such shortages have affected, and will continue to affect patients.



In recent years, successive governments have introduced measures to tackle staff shortages, including commissioning the NHS to publish a long-term workforce strategy and publishing a white paper on reforming adult social care.

Many people set to leave the UK Construction Sector, creating skills gaps



According to the CITB (Construction Industry Training Board) Workforce Skills and Mobility in the Construction Sector 2022 report, the current UK construction workforce is made up of those aged 25 to 44 (50%) and those aged 45 to 59 (25%), while there is just 19% aged under 25.

This ageing population and lack of younger construction workers is a big cause of the skills shortage. The need for a work life balance is sought after by young people. There is also a perception that construction jobs are seen as low-pay and low-skills jobs and this is very outdated. According to a CIOB report, in the UK, the average annual earnings in construction in 2022 were around £36,000 compared to £33,000 across all other sectors.
