Key Stage 4 Scholars Programme Graduation Event

A selected group of our Year 10 students celebrated the successful completion of The Scholars Programme, a national university access programme, by attending the programmes graduation event at Goldsmiths University. As part of the programme, these students were encouraged to think and work independently across seven tutorials with a subject expert PhD researcher. During the programme their topic focus was "Things Can Only Get Better: A Short History of Ideas about Progress", with the final assessment requiring them to formulate a challenging essay which was given a university-level grade. In addition to this, at the event Jugaldeep Singh and Rayner McGhee delivered an outstanding speech about their experience on the programme and the skills they had developed. The Scholars Programme has enabled these students to learn beyond the core curriculum and has helped them to develop key skills for university and later in life, such as critical thinking and problem solving.

The key stage 3 Scholars Programme has begun with a selected group of Year 8 students, and we are excited to the see the work they will produce in their final essay.
