Bike Safety tips

Riding a bike home from school can be a great way to get some exercise and fresh air but when it's dark outside, it can also be a bit nerve-wracking. However, with the right precautions, it's possible to make the journey safely.

First and foremost, make sure your bike is equipped with lights. A headlight is essential so that you can see where you're going, and a taillight will help drivers see you from behind. If you don't have lights, consider investing in some before you ride in the dark.

Next, dress appropriately. Wear reflective clothing or add reflective tape to your clothing or bike to increase your visibility to drivers. A helmet is always a good idea, but it's especially important when it's dark outside.

Finally, plan your route carefully. Stick to well-lit roads and avoid areas that are known to be unsafe. If possible, ride with a friend or in a group to increase your visibility and safety.

ICELAND TRIP

On Friday 13th October, 39 students and 4 staff left Gildredge House on a whistle stop tour of some of the fantastic sights Iceland has to offer. We left the UK from Stansted airport and landed in Keflavik, to be met by our coach driver, who took us to see several geothermal vents and a recent large lava flow that was still steaming. We then headed to Reykjavik and had dinner in the capitals famous Hamburger Factory, before settling in to our nearby hotel.

Students were woken early by our Icelandic tour guide, to jump back on the coach as we headed to an 8,000 year old lava tube that led us into the depths of subterranean Iceland. Our Welsh geologist guide explained how the lava tube formed and encouraged us to switch our lights off for a moment to appreciate the total darkness in the tube. From here we headed east and stopped at our next location, Solhiemajokull, a glacier that travels down from the nearby ice sheet covering a large volcano called Katla. Students put on crampons and ice axes and were led by professional guides up onto the glacier. We carefully walked between the moulins to a view point 500m above the glaciers snout.

After this fabulous experience we headed back to the coach and visited the southern most point of Iceland, perched on headland where huge arches and volcanic black sand beaches stretched off into the distance. That night we stayed in a remote hotel, where we aimed to see the northern lights, but unfortunately were not lucky enough.


Following another early start, we were soon standing under the huge Skogafoss waterfall before traveling behind nearby Seljalandsfoss. From here we travelled into the famous Golden Circle to visit Strokkur, a very active geyser. Our day continued seeing incredible sights before we dined in another restaurant, before heading to the world famous Blue Lagoon luxury spa. For two hours in the Iceland night, students sipped on ice slushies, whilst bathing in the naturally heated pools. Now very relaxed, we headed to our final hotel, before waking to fly home.


It was a fantastic trip which showed how incredibly diverse Iceland is.






