Hands on History

On Monday, Year 4 primary were lucky enough to have Hands-on History to come in and teach them all about Vikings.

They started the day by creating a timeline, starting with the modern day. Bit by bit, they started to piece together a timeline from the modern day all the way back to the bronze age. Using this timeline, they then investigated where Vikings fell on that timeline in relation to other major historic events and periods. They had the opportunity to hold and wear lots of historic items!



After break time, they then did some workshops. These involved exploring the different jobs Vikings had by looking at equipment they would have used









Hands on History

When they came back together after lunch, they had the opportunity to learn about different animals that were important to the Vikings, building on previous learning that many Viking artistic styles were centred around animals (and knots). They did this by inspecting skins and skulls. animal Finally, we saw our teachers leg be amputated! This was followed by an explanation about how, in Viking times, you had only 90 seconds to complete an amputation with no pain relief before the poor individual would go into shock and lose their life!














Year 2 Stay and Learn

The shop will open again on Friday 19 January with further opening times planned for each month after that.


