Could you be our Young Chef of 2023?

"A dish fit for a King"

Imagine you have been asked to cook a meal for King Charles – we would like you to design a dish to celebrate our King and his recent Coronation. King Charles believes very strongly in supporting British produce and a large amount of food is grown in his own estates in England and Scotland. He is said to like quite simply prepared food, not too spicy, of very good quality and he is an expert gardener who loves organic produce.

Your food teacher (Mrs Chalk) will organise the first round of the competition in your school, one finalist from each year group (years 7/8, and 9/10) will be chosen and then you will get together with the finalists from other schools where a team of judges will choose the overall Eastbourne Young Chef of 2023

What will you need to do in the first round?

- Submit your initial idea of a hot main course meal
- You will need to work out the cost of the ingredients of each meal (examples are available of how to do this) this must not exceed £4.95 per portion
- You must also create and cost (but not prepare) a suitable starter and dessert to accompany the main meal

If you are selected you will be invited to attend after school to cook your main meal. A local head chef will be invited in to choose the 2 finalists from each key stage to compete against other schools. The final will be held in Cavendish School on 27 June 2023 and you will have 1.5 hours to cook two portions of your hot main course meal. For more information or questions please contact Mrs Chalk.
