KEY REMINDERS - UNIFORM

Accessorising the uniform with prohibited garments/items is a breach of the policy and will incur a sanction should a student fail to meet this expectation.



We wanted to remind you about the Generation Juice initiative that was introduced at the start of this year by the Eco Committee. This initiative aims to reduce plastic waste and limit kitchen waste. We believe that this is an important initiative that benefits not only the environment but the Gildredge Hosue community as a whole.

As you know, students can purchase a reusable glass and help themselves to whatever beverage they would like. However, we have noticed that glasses are being misused and lost. To address this issue, a 30p deposit will be added to the cost of the drink starting next week. We want to be clear that this is not to increase the cost of drinks, but rather to hold students accountable.

When you return the glass to the canteen staff, the 30p deposit will be reinstated to the students' sQuid account. If you would rather avoid paying the deposit, you are welcome to bring in a reusable 250ml glass from home.
