#### **KEY REMINDERS - WEATHER UPDATES**

- With half term approaching and with the weather set to improve, it's advised that students bring a refillable water bottle. This can be filled up with water throughout the day during warm spells of weather. We would ask if students bring a refillable water bottle into the school that is clearly labelled with a name.
- We would ask that students try and avoid plastic, single-use plastic bottles.
- Students should only be bringing drinks of water into school, not anything else (e.g. Prime or energy drinks).

#### **REMINDERS - PRIMARY**

- Please ensure that when you have collected your children at the end of the day, you leave via the gates immediately (unless waiting to speak to the teacher). This allows for staff standing at the gate to attend meetings on time. Children shouldn't be playing in the garden or on the MUGA at the end of the day.
- When children arrive at school in the morning they should make their way to the entrance gate, rather than playing on the school field or garden.








## **Drop off & Parking Refresher**

Lately, more and more cars have been parking on the driveway making it harder for those parents that equally need to use the driveway. Have a look at the Drop-off arrangements for a reminder on the process.





#### Parent Parking / Student Drop-off: Mornings Only

Parents of students in Reception and Year 1 should park in the parent parking area located round the perimeter of the car park. Please note: if you have children in multiple Year Groups including a child in Reception

#### Use of Car Park and School Drive

All users must:

- 1. Follow road markings which are provided for everyone's safety.
- 2. Restrict speed to a maximum of 5mph.
- 3. Park carefully in designated spaces, avoiding double yellow lines or designated drop-off zones.

and Year 1 should park in the parent por Year 1, you may park in Reception and Year 1 area indicated on the map with red triangles. Please note Kiss & Drop Off is for Primary students only.

Parents of students in Year 2-6 should proceed to drive up the school driveway using the left-hand lane, observing the speed limit of 5mph and drop the student(s) at the top of the drive before reaching the zebra crossing, then follow the drive round to the right and proceed out of the school grounds, giving way to cars leaving the school car park.

#### **End of Day Arrangements**

All parents must use the car park at the end of the school day to collect their child, with the exception of drivers holding a Blue Badge and taxis who may proceed up the driveway.

- You will need to work out the cost of the ingredients of each meal (examples are available of how to do this) this must not exceed £4.95 per portion
- You must also create and cost (but not prepare) a suitable starter and dessert to accompany the main meal

If you are selected you will be invited to attend after school to cook your main meal. A local head chef will be invited in to choose the 2 finalists from each key stage to compete against other schools. 














# PRE-LOVED UNIFORM SALE
