Gildredge House's Eco Committee attended the Festival of Creativity 2023, Hosted by the Coastal Schools Project and the Pevensey Bay To Eastbourne Coastal Management Scheme, hosted at Eastbourne College.

Our Year 9 Reporter Oli gives us an insight into the day......

On the 16th of November, Gildredge House's Eco Committee travelled to Eastbourne College for the Festival Of Creativity where the day consisted of:

- Showcasing new innovative ways to tackle the rising sea levels and a higher consistency of storms arriving at our coastline
- Brainstorming ideas on how to educate people about our coastline and the impact of the ocean on the UK's coastal towns

We travelled as a group around a section of Eastbourne College going to different zones to inspire us and the other schools about different opportunities around the coast, visualising the impact of climate change and the future if we do nothing, learning about how we can protect our beautiful coastline for generations to come and how we can work hand in hand with nature to protect not only what's on land but what's in the water as well.

#### **Zone 1: Virtual Reality and Flood Modelling**

Activity: Virtual reality headsets and a screen were provided to allow the visualisation of what a flooded Eastbourne would look like if we did nothing. Flood maps were provided to see what would happen on a larger scale.

#### **Zone 2: Future Career Pathways**

Activity: Representatives from Environment Agency, Eastbourne Borough Council, JBA Consulting Environment And Engineering, VolkerStevin Civil Engineering And Construction, Pixel Mill Digital Creative Technology. They also provided us with information about work experience, apprenticeships and links with higher education.

#### **Zone 3: Coastal Processes and Shortlist Options**

Activity: Using wave tanks to show the effectiveness of different sea defences and also using a sand pit to show how using drones can give a far more precise way of analysing beaches for shingle placement.

#### Zone 4: Nature-Based Solutions and Climate Change

Activity: The wave tank and nature-based solution model explained how natural sea defences for example artificial reefs can increase flood defence, biodiversity and tourism it can also have a lower carbon footprint than concrete so is more climate friendly.

#### Overall this event was a great way to not only highlight current issues but to explore how to help resolve them.

In October I was fortunate enough to be part of the Gildredge House field trip to Iceland. As a year 13 Geography A-Level student it was an extremely interesting place to visit. It was a pretty whirlwind, starting with a 4am alarm clock call on the first day and ending with a 2am alarm clock call on the last day! The highlights for me personally was climbing up the Solheimajokull Glacier with icepick and crampons, exploring the Raufarholshellir lava tunnel and of course, bathing in the iconic Blue Lagoon.

The recent volcanic events only serves to illustrate how lucky we were to be there at a time of stability and what a fantastically interesting geographical destination Iceland is. As interesting as this may be one should be mindful that this is home to over 350 thousand people whose families and livelihoods could be devastated by the current volcanic events in the country. It is very sad to think that the places we visited only a month ago are being evacuated. There have been nearly 800 earthquakes (at the time of writing this) on the Reykjanes peninsular, near the capital Reykjavik.
